

The NIDUS Research Resource Core is completing the final round of testing before launching the Delirium Research Database. The Delirium Research Database will contain information about completed and ongoing research studies including delirium as a primary or secondary outcome or predictor, along with study contact information. Our hope is that this will serve as a valuable resource for researchers conducting systematic reviews, metaanalyses, or searching for potential collaborations and data-sharing opportunities.

Resources of Interest

<u>The Delirium Bibliography</u> is a searchable bibliography of over 2,000 scientific articles on delirium, indexed by Medline and other relevant databases. It is updated with new articles on a monthly database and is accessible via the Hospital Elder Life Program website.


