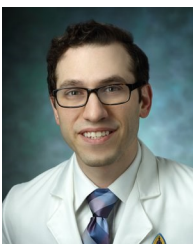
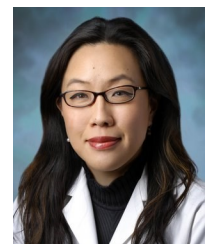


### **Thomas M. Gill, MD**

Dr. Thomas Gill is Professor of Medicine, Epidemiology, and Investigative Medicine and the Humana Foundation Professor of Geriatric Medicine at Yale University. He is a leading authority on the epidemiology and prevention of disability among older persons and holds several leadership positions at Yale: Director of the Program on Aging and Claude D. Pepper Older Americans Independence Center, Director of the Center on Disability and Disabling Disorders, and Director of an NIA-funded postdoctoral training program in Geriatric Clinical Epidemiology and Aging-Related Research. He has received a MERIT Award from the NIH and is an elected member of the American Society of Clinical Investigation and Association of American Physicians.

### **Esther Oh, MD, PhD**

Dr. Esther Oh is an Associate Professor of Medicine, Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences and Pathology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. She specializes in evaluation and management of memory disorders, has an extensive experience in evaluating memory disorders in older adults with multiple chronic diseases, and takes an integrative approach in the treatment of memory disorders. Dr. Oh also serves as the associate director of the Johns Hopkins Memory and Alzheimer's Treatment Center and is certified in geriatrics and internal medicine by the American Board of Internal Medicine.



### **Nicholas Reed, AuD**

Dr. Nicholas Reed is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Epidemiology at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health with a joint appointment in the Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. His research focuses on direct-to-consumer hearing care, understanding hearing aid use in the United States, the relationship between hearing loss and health care outcomes/interactions and whether interventions targeting hearing loss can mitigate these associations. Dr. Reed is core faculty at the Cochlear Center for Hearing and Public Health and is the Director of the Audiology core.
