Updates from NIDUS at ADS

The NIDUS team, led by Dr. Sharon Inouye, gave an update on all NIDUS events and activities over the past year, and plans for the upcoming year during the Monday afternoon session.

- The <u>Mentoring and Career Development Task Force</u> will lead the 2018 Delirium Boot Camp at the Nittany Lion Inn in Pennsylvania this October. They are also planning to offer a series of career development webinars over the next year.
- The **Pilots and Innovation Task Force** awarded two \$50,000 pilot awards last fall, and will offer <u>at least two more \$50,000 pilots this year</u>. Applications are open to both junior and experienced investigators from the US and internationally.
- The Dissemination Task Force leads all communication efforts for NIDUS and has developed a robust presence online through a <u>blog</u> and <u>social media</u>. NIDUS also participated World Delirium Awareness Day 2018, helping to spread delirium awareness.
- The Research Resources Core has finalized the <u>Delirium Research Catalog</u>, which includes over 180 studies to date. The Catalog Browser, which will allow users to search the catalog, is undergoing final testing and will become public in August 2018. If you have an ongoing or completed delirium study that you would like to include in the Catalog,

- The Measurement and Harmonization Core has developed a <u>variety of resources</u> to improve delirium assessment. The <u>Delirium Severity Crosswalk Tool</u>, created through harmonization of the CAM-S, DRS-R-98 and MDAS allows users to convert scores from one measure to another.
