The American Delirium Society Conference Planning Committee announces the Call for Abstracts (oral and poster) for the 2023 ADS Annual Meeting in Providence, RI, June 11-13, 2023.

Areas of interest may include (but are not limited to) case reports, basic science, assessment, treatment, prevention, implementation, and education. Topics must contain novel content from those presented in prior years. Abstracts must be submitted by January 8, 2023. ADS will give consideration for an oral or poster award in one of the following five categories:

- Predoctoral Trainee
- Postdoctoral Trainee
- Translational
- Education/Quality Improvement
- Clinical

Submission Guidelines

- Abstracts results must not have been published previously in a peerreviewed publication.
- Must be submitted using the online submission form.
- Abstracts are peer-reviewed according to criteria including: originality, quality, clarity of message, and significance of results
- Presenting authors are required to pay registration fees.

Abstract Presentation Style

Unless noted at submission time that only a poster presentation is preferred, authors of top-scoring abstracts will present their research during an abstract session. Presenters will have a maximum of 10 minutes followed by five minutes of Q&A. Accepted abstracts not presented during oral abstract sessions may present a short abstract presentation during a poster session.

New Investigator Awards
