

Core Outcomes Sets for Delirium Trials

Trials of interventions to prevent or treat delirium frequently report heterogenous outcomes that limit evidence synthesis. To address this concern, the use core outcome sets in delirium trials is recommended.

In this webinar, Dr. Louise Rose, leader of the international DelCOrS research group, will explore the rationale for the use of core outcome sets and how they are developed. She will then present four core outcome sets for research into interventions to prevent or treat delirium in four patient populations i.e., critically ill adults; patients admitted to an acute hospital but not requiring critical care; those receiving palliative care; and those over 65 and resident in a long-term care setting.
