John Devlin, PharmD, BCCCP, MCCM, FCCP

John Devlin is a professor of pharmacy at Northeastern University an associate scientist in the Division of Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital, Boston, MA. His research focuses on the detection, prevention and treatment of delirium and disrupted sleep in the ICU and the pharmacoepidemiology of delirium in critically ill adults. He currently serves as a NIDUS co-investigator; co-directing the dissemination core and the annual research bootcamp. He is a past president of the American Delirium Society.



Leanne Boehm, PhD, RN, ACNS-B, FCCM, FAAN

Leanne Boehm is an assistant professor of nursing at Vanderbilt University. She also serves as an investigator with the Critical Illness, Brain Dysfunction and Survivorship (CIBS) and faculty with the Vanderbilt Center for Clinical Quality and Implementation Research. Dr. Boehm's research aims to eliminate delirium, oversedation, and immobilization in intensive care, and maximize the quality of survivorship for patients and family members following critical illness. Her current research is evaluating the efficacy of telehealth ICU recovery care services and implementation of digital interventions to enhance family engagement and empowerment in the ICU.
